Our Unique Story

Our heritage originated with the Canning Stock Route (CSR). Our role has evolved over the last 20 years, and we have demonstrated our commitment to ongoing maintenance and renovation works of over 15 wells in that period.

Our identity is as an Environment and Conservation Group, with a positive contribution to the protection of bush heritage and advocating responsible access for off-road recreational use.

Our model of close collaboration, as a tripartite agreement between Government, Voluntary Groups and Commercial Enterprise has been proven to work in delivering sustainable management outcomes.

A positive success story has been the protection of important clay-based wetlands in the Wandoo National Park collaboratively with DBCA and the Motor Trade Association of WA.

We have a positive Return on Investment (ROI) through delivery of results with Government funding. For example, our Rangelands work at Dampierwah State Farm and Warriedar Homestead has been well received by the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA).

We are now diversified and growing. We now work across a range of areas, including family-friendly work in the Karara Rangeland park, maintaining heritage of former pastoral station homesteads, providing a foundation leadership role with the Code Off Road series, clean-up weekends on the south coast, delivering bikes for school kids in the Kimberley, and continued support for CSR and broader Rangelands initiatives.

Our legacy is to deliver:

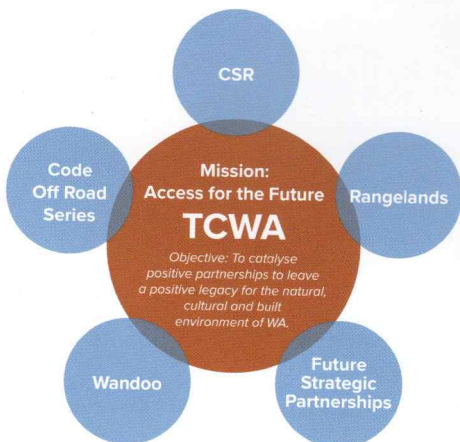

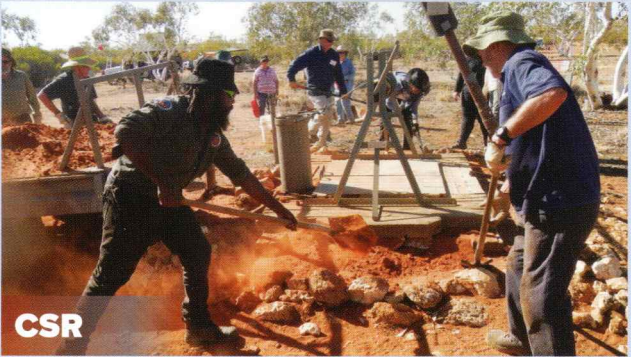
We are evolving and are seeking member support and active participation to build on the positive momentum, and have a lot of fun along the way.

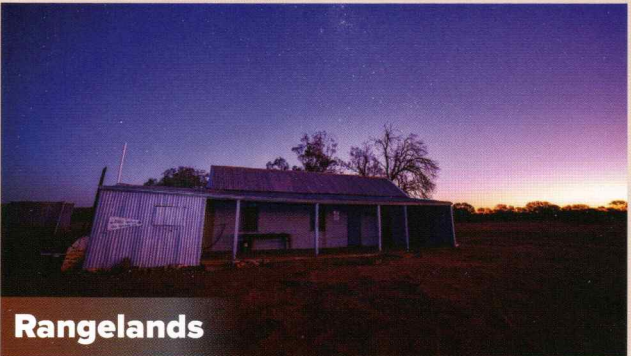

Rangelands

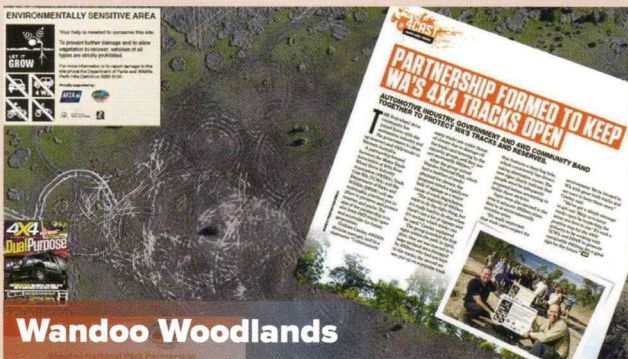

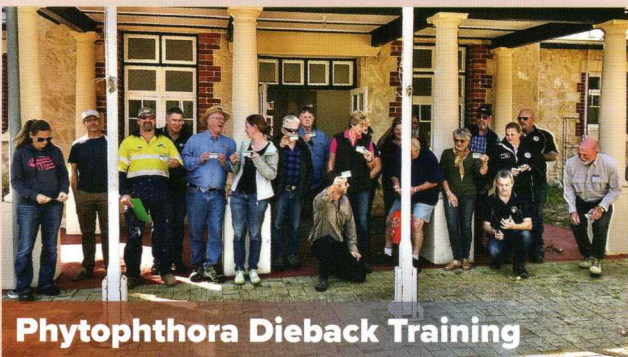
Wandoo Woodlands

Partnership Development Initiatives

Developing relationships with like-minded overlanders is vital. Members of the 4WD Club of WA Inc., Austravel SafetyNet Inc., and Track Care WA Inc. volunteers at ex Narloo work-shopped and exchanged ideas of mutual interest.



Phytophthora Dieback Training

Graduates of a training partnership with DBCA to raise awareness among recreational 4WD and motorised recreational vehicle operators about Phytophthora Dieback and other biosecurity issues.

Code Off Road

The first Code Off Road leaflet was produced in partnership with the Parks and Wildlife Service, Swan Districts as the first step towards developing an educational program for motorised recreation users to the Wilbinga Conservation Park. It is intended to be as generic as possible so that it can be used in various similar coastal locations.

Place-specific information such as maps or other relevant material will be inserted or bundled to meet local requirements. We have found that partnerships between land managers and industry supporters working together with Track Care WA is beneficial to the purpose of appropriate natural resource administration. Subsequent Code Off Road flyers will be created on a case-by-case basis to assist land managers to provide practical and useful guidance to visitors.

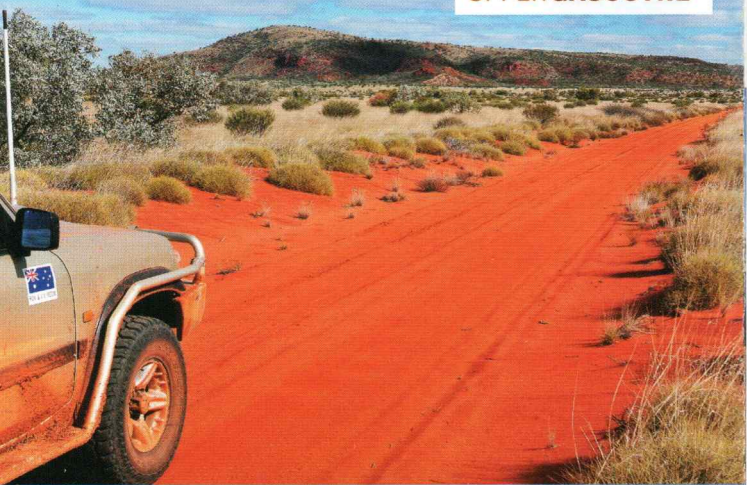
Responsible and skilled driving minimises degradation to coastal ecosystems, accidents and the spread of *Phytophthora dieback*.



Remote Travel Tips

Please ensure you have:

- Sufficient fuel to complete your journey
- Sufficient drinking water on board for trip (minimum 5L per person per day)
- Informed someone of your travel plan including destination, direction and estimated arrival times
- A reliable and road-worthy 4WD vehicle
- Spare tyres and vehicle parts
- Recent road map of the local area
- First aid kit
- Satellite phone or personal location device beacon (preferable)
- In the event of an emergency call 000 or the RFDS on 1800 625 800.
